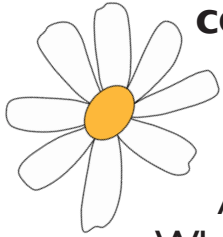


# The tour highlights 10 exceptional spots.

**No dogs are allowed in the gardens. Please be considerate when you're parking. Thank you.**



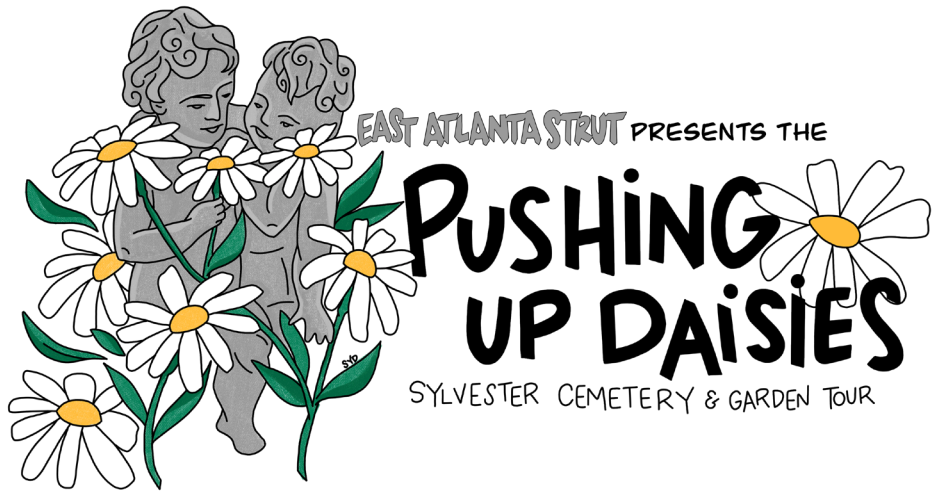
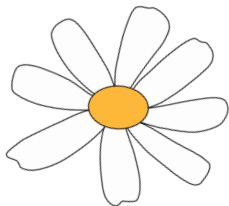
**709 Clifton Road SE:**  
*A Storm of Beauty*

When a tornado took down a huge tree in this gardener's backyard, there were two options: fill the hole with a swimming pool or create a secret backyard garden.

**1899 Montvallo Ter. SE:** *On the Border*  
At the edge of East Atlanta, you'll recognize this garden from the lush plant border along the front driveway.

**1370 Orange Blossom Terrace:**  
*A Rainbow of Blooms*  
Annuals and pottery are mixed with trees, shrubs and perennials that combine to offer interest and color everywhere a visitor looks.

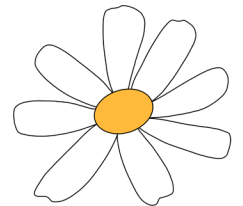
**749 Flat Shoals Ave. SE:** *Beauty Evolving*  
This garden recently became "City Forest Certified" by Trees Atlanta. It's also adjacent to Ormewood Forest. **Note:** This garden and the next two are an easy walk from one another.



**1356 Ormewood:** *Gearing Down*  
20 years of landscaping has paid off, providing this busy family with a beautiful garden perfect for winding down after a long day.

**769 Shadowridge:** *Made in the Shade*  
The goal of these gardeners over the past four-plus years has been to establish a more native sustainable ecosystem.

**673 Brownwood:**  
*Five Gardens in One!*  
When this gardener began in the '90s, he had four trees and a rose bush. Now there are five garden "rooms."



**716 Gresham Ave SE:** *Kid-friendly fun*  
Gardens and children don't always mix, but these gardeners have created a space that's warm and cheery, and most importantly, fun!

**1447 Newton:** *Living a Wildlife*  
This cottage garden provides a welcoming environment for visitors of all species.
