

The tour highlights 11 exceptional spots.

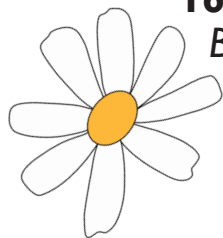

This gardener has been working on her traditional landscape for many years.

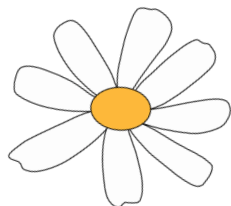
1379 Orange Blossom Terrace:

A Family Garden

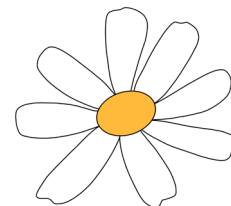
These gardeners have taken a yard that had almost nothing and made it into a kid-friendly garden that offers year-round interest.
